Year 1 have had a lovely week. We have worked super hard at writing a diary in English. In Maths we have been looking at number lines up to 20 and estimating where numbers go. In Science we have built some homes using 3 different materials, paper, cardboard and sticks. We will leave these houses outside for 3 weeks and check on them every week to see if they have survived the weather and which material is the strongest. Please ensure children are reading everyday at home, we have given out Oxford Owl log ins again incase you have lost them. We have also given children a reading log and 1 book at thier level for them to read at home too.We have PE on a Wednesday, please make sure children are wearing the correct PE kit and trainers.

The children have had an amazing week in Year 2. We have worked incredibly hard with our latest big write, an information text all about the UK! The children should be really proud with what they've achieved. In Geography, we have explored Dungeness and in Science we have learned how seeds grow into plants. In Art, we learned about collage and practiced the skill in preparation for our own collage of an artwork by Monet. We have finished our money topic in Maths- please keep practicing how to make amounts and calculate change at home as it can be challenging! Please ensure children are still bringing a water bottle to school every day!

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Year 3 had an excellent week filled with lots of activities. In our English lessons, we delved deeper into the world of Greek myths, focusing on the adventures of the demigod Perseus. We can't wait to show off the rich language we have learnt in our Big Writes! In History, we had an exciting lesson immersing ourselves in the Greek amphitheater using the VR headsets. In Art we have started to look at Greek objects, finding out all about their designs and uses. We can't wait to get started on our very own Greek pot designs! Please remember to wear PE kits on a Monday and dress up warm for Forest School on a Wednesday.

On Wednesday we will be attending Forest School, so please make sure to be wearing suitable shoes.

We have had another brilliant week in year 4 exploring life in Ancient Rome and have used the VR headsets to travel back in time to explore some significant landmarks, we have investigated how the pitch of a sound can be impacted by the length of the string on an instrument in science and have continued our knowledge of multiplication and division facts. In English we have written our descriptive narratives on time travel back to Ancient Rome and will be publishing these on Monday. Please bring reading records in on Mondays to be checked. PE kits need to be worn on Tuesdays and Fridays. A trip letter went out today, please ensure it is bought back next week.

This week Year 5 have been understanding the Maya number system and working out calculations using them. We have also been understanding how the Maya Civilisation used pictures and diagrams to write. We came up with a secret message to our class mates! In English we have been learning about the features of a suspense narrative. We have edited our intial opening paragraphs but ensuring we pick precise vocabulary to create mood and atmosphere. In Art we have started to construct our Maya masks, making them individual and unqiue and representative of us. In Maths we have completed our fractions topic and have moved on to making connections with multiplication and division. We learnt that if we halve one factor we must double the other so our product stays the same. Year 5 will be holding an exhibition of their learning on Thursday 8th February at 2:30pm. A reminder that Year 5 booster clubs are on a Tuesday until 4:15pm.

Next week we are going to understand how to put a character's thoughts in our writing to create suspense.







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
