Next week we will be learning about the festival of Easter and doing lots of fun craft activities for this.



In English we wrote Balanced Arguments to answer the question 'Hidden Figures: Did they Impact the Space Race?' The writing in Year 5 was fantastic, with lots of children using relative clauses and parenthesis! In Maths we have been learning how to multiply unit and non unit fractions and have even learnt a technique to multiply mixed numbers. We completed an investigation in science looking at the phases of the moon. It was great to see and understand how the Earth orbits the sun and how the Moon orbits the earth!
