


Geography: UK 	I can name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom I can name, locate and identify characteristics of the seas surrounding the United Kingdom	Look at England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales individually Think about the flowers of each country and label on a map alongside the seas Name the capital cities of the 4 countries of the United Kingdom Look closer at Dungeness (UKs only desert) – England Discover Inverewe Garden – Scotland Look at the Portmeirion Gardens – Wales Discover Hillsborough Castle and Gardens – Northern Ireland
